4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Eye contact

Immediately flush eyes with plenty of cool water for at least 15 minutes. Get medical attention if irritation occurs.

Skin contact

Inhalation

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable extinguishing media
